# Film Festival Not Far Away

The Charlton Arts group is delighted to announce the 28<sup>th</sup> Charlton Film Festival on February 28 & 29 at The Rex Cinema Charlton. I'm sure many of you have already marked these dates in your diaries and on your calendars and you'll be counting the sleeps until this feast of film, food and fun!

As well as the five main films this year you'll have the opportunity to view three multiple award-winning short films by director Natalie Van den Dungen after each of the daytime films on Saturday ranging from 4-10 minutes in length.

There's a great selection of films this year starting with A Boy Called Sailboat (PG) on Friday at 8 pm. A Hispanic family find hope in their extraordinary son named Sailboat who leads an offbeat cast in this whimsical, slightly magical tale about a young boy and his guitar. You'll find this a joy to watch. It's directed by Australian filmmaker Cameran Nugent who'll participate in a Q&A following the film's screening.

Cameron Nugent's first television appearance was in an advertisement at the age of 12. Soon after he found himself with a lead role in the children's television series, Round the Twist. This led to a string of roles and from television he progressed to films. Later at university he directed his talents towards television and film production and he was soon writing, producing and directing.

On Saturday morning at 11 am we open with Woman At War (M) Halla risks all she has to protect the highlands of Iceland against the powerful forces of industry but her life changes when she is finally granted permission to adopt a girl from the Ukraine. The short film is Bunny New Girl (6 min)

After lunch at the Charlton Club we have **The Farewell** at **2** pm. Bill's family returns to China under the guise of a fake wedding to say goodbye to their beloved matriarch – the only person who doesn't know she only has a few weeks to live. The warmth and

genuine feeling stays with you. The short is **Sherbert Razencrantz**, **You're Beautiful** (10 min)

The next film at **4.15** pm is a documentary **Amazing Grace** featuring Aretha Franklin as you've never seen her before – an electrifying performance at the New Bethal Baptist Church in Watts, Los Angeles in 1972. The short is **Let it Out**, a music video featuring Magda Szubanski (4 min)

The closing film of the festival on Saturday night at 8 pm is **The Peanut Butter Factory** an adventure story set in the world of a modern Mark Twain. After running away from a nursing home to pursue his dream of becoming a pro wrestler, Zac, who has Down Syndrome, befriends an outlaw who becomes his coach and ally. The feel-good movie of 2019.

One of the highlights of the festival is the gathering together in the in-between times to stretch your legs, and your minds, as you enjoy gourmet food and chew the fat about the film you've just seen.

You can see all five films and enjoy lunch on Saturday and suppers on Friday and Saturday nights for \$80, the cost of a season ticket. Saturday tickets at \$70 will give you four films plus lunch and supper. Saturday lunch and one film is \$22. Friday and Saturday night tickets for film and supper are \$20 and single film tickets are \$12.

The laughter, the chatter and lively discussion both pre and post the event highlighted the potential that arts have to bridge the worlds of different people, how we can engage our imagination and create wonderful experiences that can be shared by everyone.

The evening commenced with Darren Mills discussing his diverse range of pieces on display. Darren described his art as 'impressionist', where artworks portray overall visual effect instead of details. He had a range of mediums from graphite zebras to pastel pups and amazing oil/acrylic pieces of a baboon and a Namibian Tribeswoman. Darren's work is heavily influenced by his experiences as a game ranger in Africa. For those who missed seeing Darren's work live they can be viewed at Darren Mills Art on Facebook.

Bruce Gardner commenced the live performances reciting some poetry. Bruce explained how his poetry had developed from writing lyrics for his band, many years ago. Bruce had the audience captivated as he delivered pieces inspired by a trip to Tasmania, the audience silently sat in contemplation as Bruce delivered his works.

Natasha Saunders was the guest speaker for the evening. Natasha played a video showcasing photographic work produced by her Charlton College Year 8 class, overlayed with the music that inspired it 'Streets of your town", by the Go-Betweens. She commenced with a delightful song from the Andes, then skipped to America and Ireland. Her version of Celtic song 'Spirit of the Moon', had the audience enraptured and there is no doubt that this will be the first of

many appearances on stage for Heidi and her guitar.

Father Peter Jose took to the stage next and delighted the audience by playing his organ and singing Bollywood songs. Fr. Peter explained his Indian heritage and his love of music. Although the audience did not understand the lyrics they were clapping to the tune and dancing in their seats. Fr. Peter is moving to Robinvale and this was the final chance to enjoy his entertaining music, which was appreciated by all.

Written in 1933, for The Dorsey Brothers Orchestra (including Glenn Miller), this piece showcases the saxophone, which Kyle has been playing since 11. The song's length of nearly 4 minutes at an upbeat tempo is incredibly difficult but Kyle made it look so easy and entertaining and everyone in the audience was incredibly impressed.

The evening concluded with everyone partaking in a drink and enjoying a chance to chat about the performances in the lovely Rex Theatre foyer over supper.

Charlton Neighbourhood House, Charlton Arts and Charlton Forum combine to present Saloon D'Art and appreciate all the performers giving their time and talent and everyone in the audience for supporting. 

around the water, and gained the opportunity to experience swimming whilst dressed, performing rescues and wearing PFDs. This should set students in good stead for the summer.


