Festival Opener Captures Hearts

By Jenny Pollard Charlton's 28th Film Festival began with a celebrated opening night on Friday 28 February with the captivating indie movie "A Boy Named Sailboat".

At just 92 minutes in length this short, but engaging story of family and a young boy's ability to create magical outcomes from a small discarded guitar was greatly enhanced by the post-screening discussion with director/writer Cameron Nugent.

A familiar face from the television screen, (Sea Change, Blue Heelers, Around The Twist), Cameron's effusive and heart-felt manner was on show even before the lights dimmed as he chatted about what was to come in his first time role as a director. There were no stand-offish mannerisms-just passion for a story which we came to hear held many deeper meanings.

Featuring a largely unknown cast-with three young non-professional child actors carrying the weight of the movie-it was immediately engaging through the quality of the story, the naturalness of the children, the gentle humor and arresting visuals of the Hispanic locale of Silver City, New Mexico where it was filmed. The icing on the cake was the beautiful guitar backing by Australia's Grigoryan Brothers-Slava and Leonard.

For an indie movie the coming on board

of Academy Award winning actor J.K. Simmons (best known for his electrifying portrayal of the brutal drumming teacher in the movie "Whiplash") was a dream-come-true for the director, who wanted the star, but was told to - "be realistic". When the actor phoned back saying he'd love to be in the film, Cameron said his first response was that it was a hoax call from a friend.

"With a budget of only around \$1 million for the whole movie, when J.K. said "yes" we suddenly wondered if we would be able to pay him," said Cameron, "however he is the most generous and gentle person, and he agreed to about a tenth of his daily rate, and then donated half of that back to Breast Cancer Australia.'

Cameron's wife, Skye, was diagnosed with terminal breast cancer just a year after they were married, and despite warnings the couple decided to travel, and it was at a stopover in Silver City that Skye decided the movie should be filmed there. While she didn't live to see it made, Cameron said she would have been very proud of the outcome.

While the film champions individuals' unique gifts – focusing on things which might inhibit and turning them into strengths Cameron said he was very specific about needing to find young actors who were similar to the characters. "We were under a lot of pressure from LA to use trained kids -

we saw around 1,200 taped auditions from professional kids, but we ended up going to the local school where we found exactly what we wanted."

With the Film Festival crowd asking questions ranging from how to draw emotional responses from the children, to how the story was developed, the significance of the repetitive diet of meatballs in the on-screen family home and how the talented Grigoryan brothers were coaxed into supporting the movie, the evening continued apace over supper in the Rex foyer.

With four more films in this series to come, the next one - "The Forever Gang" - is due to start filming in Vancouver in August with former Charlton local (and international blues/roots musician) C.W. Stoneking writing the music.

Filled with praise for the Rex Theatre, Cameron said it was almost a replica of the Silco Theatre in Silver City where "A Boy Named Sailboat" first launched. "I just cannot believe it," he said as he gazed around the filling auditorium.

With an eye to bringing the movie back with the Grigoryans playing the soundtrack live, those who missed the film this time may have another opportunity to catch one of the stand-outs from the 2020 Charlton Arts Film Festival.

David Helfgott An Unforgettable Music Experience

A standing ovation brought a night of unrivalled musical expression to a close with one of the most acclaimed and well-known pianists in the world gracing Charlton's Rex Theatre stage on the 8^{th} February.

David Helfgott's brilliant and effortlessly executed playing infused the auditorium with an electric atmosphere which had built even before the almost capacity audience entered the venue.

"Spellbinding", "stupendous", "breathtaking" were just some of the adjectives used to describe a performance which mesmerized the audience to silence as the maestro unveiled his mastery.

In a program showcasing his bravura talent, pieces demanding a virtuoso technique such as Beethoven's Opus 53 (Waldstein) and the Chopin Ballades No.1 and No.4, captivated and amazed, with their spine-tingling speed and driving tempos.

Brilliant encores of the fiery and intense "Sabre Dance" (Khachaturian), and Rimsky-Korsakov's dazzling "Flight of the Bumble Bee" left the audience on a "high" as MC Wayne Phillips (radio FlowFM) likened the experience to having attended a recital in one of the world's preeminent opera houses.

"What a privilege to have the opportunity to hear an artist of David's international standing play in a country town," said Wayne during his opening welcome.

Attracting visitors from around the state, (one couple even made the trip from Melbourne when they were unable to attend David's only other Australian concert at the Melbourne Recital Hall), the audience also included Member for Ripon, Louise Staley, immediate past Mayor of Ballarat City Council, Samantha McIntosh, along with Buloke, Charlton and Donald Citizens of the Year – John McConville, John Harley and Enid Brazier. Other attendees had travelled from Wodonga, Gippsland, neighboring Buloke communities and regional centres.

Fickle weather almost deprived the Rex of this once-in-a-lifetime event, with the floods impacting the region around the Helfgott's home in Bellingen NSW. Amid concerns about being prevented from upholding their performance commitment, the situation fortunately didn't impact, and the Rex visit proceeded as planned.

Enhancing the quality of the evening the majestic Steinway D Concert Grand was carefully prepared by tuner Greg Machnacki, who worked on the instrument both before and at the interval during the performance. Based in Melbourne, Greg has travelled the world tuning many brands of pianos and was excited about being involved

with an artist of David's standing.

And it was thanks to now local Charlton resident and music teacher, Dana Czarski, that the availability of the Steinway D was on hand for use at the Rex.

Even Gillian Helfgott said she was amazed when they saw they would have access to the concert industry standard in the small town. "I couldn't believe it!" she said.

Affable and gregarious by nature, the meet-and-greets with David both before and after the performance were spontaneous and effusive affairs. Cheerful introductions, accompanied by a hug or a hand-shake, and maybe a kiss, were also reflected in his relaxed response to the audience's appreciation following each piece of music giving a double thumbs-up sign and bows.

Supported by his wife Gillian, the pair gave generously of their time following the event, talking with audience members, re-acquainting with past friends and signing programs.

At the conclusion of the performance, the couple were presented with a hamper containing a broad range of local products from across the Buloke Shire.

The Rex acknowledges with gratitude the support from Creative Victoria for the opportunity to present an artist of this calibre and for the chance to bring a premium cultural experience to a country region. From the feedback on the night, the scale of attendance, coupled with the high calibre performance, a precedent has now been set for the future.

For the support from radio station FlowFM and for Wayne Phillips for his excellent MC work the Rex also extends their thanks.







North Central Garden Club


Members set the syllabus for the coming year at the February meeting.
